Capers Edward Perry was born to the late George Norman Perry and Pauline Weaver Perry in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, on August 23, 1943.

He attended the local schools of Winston-Salem/Forsyth County and was a member of the 1961 graduating class of Atkins High School.

Mr. Perry was a gold star member of Mount Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church where he faithfully served with the Chapel, Gospel and Men's Choirs. He was the church's devoted Sexton and made certain that the building and grounds were properly maintained. He was also active with the Culinary Ministry and Amanda Galloway Aid Society.

He rose to the rank of sergeant in the United States Army as he gave honorable service for his country. He retired from RJ Reynolds Tobacco Company following 32 years of dedicated service to the company.

Capers Edward Perry peacefully passed away at Oak Forest Health and Rehabilitation Center in Winston-Salem on Saturday, May 9, 2015, following a period of illness.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister, Arnetta L. Perry and a brother and sister-in-law, Bobby (Jetty) Perry.
