

### Obituary

Mr. Clarence McMillian, Sr., affectionately called "June," was born in Forsyth County to the late Paul C. and Inez Carr McMillian on June 16, 1939.

He attended the public schools of Winston-Salem/Forsyth County and graduated from Atkins High School in the class of 1957. While attending high school, Clarence became a founding member and lead singer for the Mighty Wonders Gospel Group. He was the last survivor of the original Mighty Wonders.

Mr. McMillian began his early Christian education as a member of Mount Zion Baptist Church. He later joined Galilee Missionary Baptist Church where he enthusiastically sang with the Male Chorus. Declining health began to limit his active involvement with his home church but he felt the warmth of fellowship and experienced the joy of worship during his many visits to The Uncompromising Word Fellowship Church.

Clarence was a jovial man who had a great love for his family. And each member felt his or her own special place within that love. He was an avid fan of The Oakland Raiders Football Team and he was especially fond of "a man's best friend," his dogs.
