In the community, she was a member of the Mahalia Jackson Community Outreach, Hanes Hosiery Senior Citizens and Sisters of Bivouac Chapter 530, Order of Eastern Star.

"Ma Bitty" was the oldest member of Kimberly Park Holiness Church. Her church membership spanned over eighty years and she faithfully served on The Mothers' Board, was a member of the Senior Choir, taught the Junior Class in Sunday School and was President of the Missionary Department.
