Mrs. Lillian Doretha Payne Speas was born to the late Ellis and Della Mae Payne on May 6, 1918 in Tobaccoville, North Carolina.

Her early educational experiences took place in the "one-room schoolhouse" of the city of her birth where she was the youngest student in her classes and was taught by her future father-in-law.

She married the late Reverend Lester B. Speas, the love of her life, in 1934 and they served together in God's vineyard throughout the Western North Carolina Conference of the A.M.E. Zion Church. While demonstrating the special attributes of a minister's wife, Miss Lillian articulated as "First Lady" in various congregations. She accompanied her husband to varied church conferences and one would witness to her favorite testimonial rendition of "Let the Church Say Amen." They were married for over 54 years until his passing in 1988.

Mrs. Speas was a faithful and life-long member of Center Grove A.M.E. Zion Church in Tobaccoville. Her cheerful temperament has served as a spiritual inspiration to her local church family and to the Western North Carolina Conference. She held memberships in the Women's Home Overseas Missionary Society, Lay Council, Life Member and the Local Ministers' Wives and Spouses.

She worked as a floral designer for more than forty years at Boyles Florist and Talley's Flower Shop in King, NC and Cozart's Florist in Winston-Salem, NC. She gained oriental designing techniques from the North Carolina Floral Association in Raleigh, NC and the NC FTDI Teleflora Association. She also taught floral design-

Miss Lillian retired and then her occupation included the daily nurture of her personal flower garden. Her love of God's nature was especially evident at her home during the spring and summer months. She earned special recognition for her award winning floral designs and was an expert at designing wedding bouquets, floral arrangements for churches and beautiful memorial tributes.

God chose a beautiful and exquisite flower from His garden when he picked Lillian Doretha Payne Speas from Forsyth Medical Center in Winston-Salem on Friday, September 19, 2014. In addition to her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by her children, Wilma S. Ijames, Oscar and Cornelius Speas; her sister, Margaret Linton; and brothers, Robert and Woodrow Payne.

Those family members who survive and who will cherish her lingering fragrance include her son, Lester B.
