She was thirteen years old when the family relocated to Winston-Salem and she attended the local schools, where she graduated from Atkins High School. Following graduation she attended Winston-Salem State University and completed the requirements to become certified as a Nurse Assistant..

Ms. Myers was employed as a Certified Nurse Assistant at Winston-Salem Convalescent Center and retired from the company after more than forty years of dedicated service.

She was of the Baptist Faith and was a former member of First Calvary Baptist Church.

Ms. Myers loved to cook and she seemed to have a “green thumb” because she had a gift for reviving flowers. She often said that ‘plants were her children that didn’t talk back.’
