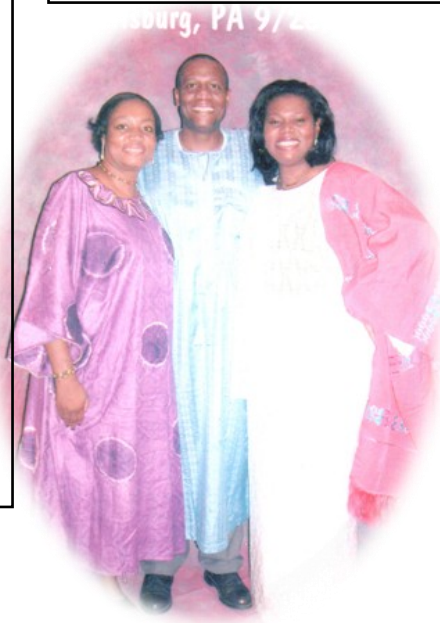


Our Sentiment
