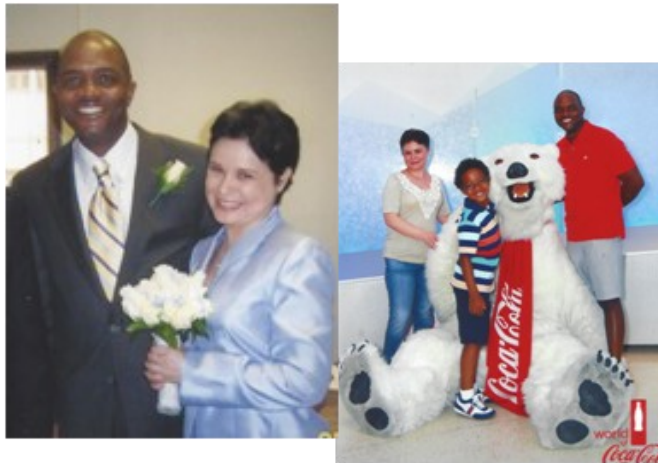

OBITUARY

Sergeant First Class Walter Antonio Moore was born in Winston-Salem, North Carolina to Doris Galloway Moore and John Walter Moore, on March 17, 1970.

He was educated in the public schools of Winston-Salem/Forsyth County and a graduate of Carver High School. Following high school graduation, he enrolled at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Design.

Mr. Moore was a College Bookstore Manager at several colleges and universities and after a period, he worked in the Sales and Marketing field. He later enlisted in the United States Army and worked as a Medic. After four years of honorable service for his country he was discharged and joined the United States Army Reserve Unit. While a reservist, he rose to the rank of Sergeant First Class, enrolled in courses which would eventually help him to reach his ultimate goal of becoming a physician's assistant. He was an active United States Army Reservist until declining health and his recent passing prevented his obtaining that goal.

Sergeant First Class Walter Antonio Moore passed away at Moses Cone Hospital in Greensboro, North Carolina on Monday, January 4, 2016.
